

Work-Based Learning Experience



Students receive support to:

- Develop paid work experiences with local employers
- Experience a job for an extended period of time
- Determine their interests
- Develop work-essential skills

Students may receive up to **90 hours of support** from an LVCIL Career Coach.

Job Shadowing Experience



- Students shadow employees at a potential job of interest
- Students can receive up to 25 hours of support from an LVCIL Career Coach.
- LVCIL Career Coaches support students 100% of the time for job shadowing

Independent Travel Training



- Assessment of Available Transportation Options
- Individual Support to Learn Independent Community Travel
- May Receive Up to 20 Hours of Support
